OCCURRENCE OF OBSIDIAN BUTTON, MT RAMSAY

Dear Sir,

MINERAL MAPS: No. 3 Meteoric Iron  
& Glass.

Since sending you this I have unearthed another reference. An obsidian button was found in 1906 by Mr. John Crawford north of Mt. Ramsay, at the point indicated by the centre of the circle on the little sketch sent enclosed. It was found 5 ft. below the ground near the bottom of the drift and just above 1 ft. of tin-bearing wash. Will you kindly add this occurrence to the map sent to you on the 9th instant?
