
MEMORANDUMUNDERGROUND WATER - MR. MORRISBY, HOWRAH

Mr. Morrisby, living at the junction of Rokeby and Pass roads asked for advice relative to the possibilities of securing an adequate supply of underground water.

His property was visited on 15th December. At that time Mr. Morrisby was constructing a dam in one of the creeks crossing his property.

The rocks outcropping on the eastern portion of the holding consist of Permean sandstones and mudstones whilst the rocks of the western portion are Dolerites.

As neither system can be regarded as aquifers Mr. Morrisby was advised against boring.
