MEMORANDUM

There are no leases in force in the vicinity of the Dover River on Cape Barren Island.

I can find no records of any boring done in the vicinity of Dover River.

Leases Nos. 2498/93M and 2499/93M were taken up to the west of Dover River in the year 1893 but were abandoned, for on 23/12/97 they were re-occupied apparently for the mining of Graphite as they were transferred in 1898 to the Tasmanian Black Lead Mining Company. These leases were void in 1901 and 1902.

To the east of Dover River Lease No. 10542/M was taken up in 1934 for the mining of tin and indefinite records show that it was probably occupied for Antimony.
