

MEMORANDUMRADIO ACTIVE DEPOSIT AT STAR HILL, GLADSTONE

If Mr. Kirton in his reference to "Star Hill" means the original site of the operations of the Star Hill Syndicate the underlying rocks would be Granite. As the area has been worked out for some years all water races should be idle. His reference to "a race which is running all the time" suggests that he may be operating in the vicinity of the present workings of the Star Hill Syndicate. Here also the underlying rocks would be granite.

Mr. Kirton is not particularly reliable in his estimates. Previously he has reported high radio activity in an area of tailings in which some monazite occurs.
