MEMORANDUMMT. LLOYD

The first bore at Mt. Lloyd has been abandoned at 322' owing to mechanical difficulties. A phone call was received from B. Garrett of A.N.M. on 11th December, and instructions were given concerning re-siting the drill.

The second bore was visited this week, and is now down to 122'. Despite unexpectedly deep weathering and heavy core loss, a fairly confident lithological correlation can be made with the first bore. The second bore is expected to reach the Ross Sandstone early in the New Year.

Samples have been taken from outcrops East 1, 2, 3, West 1, 2, and delivered to Mr. Banks for pollen analysis. Samples from West 1, 2, will be forwarded for assay.

A report of an additional seam between East 2 and 3 was investigated; the occurrence is a repetition of East 2 by a small landslide just east of Teakle's Adit.

The log of the first bore is complete, and will be forwarded shortly.
