
GRID ZONE DESIGNATION	TO ONE A STANDARD REFERENCE ON THIS SHEET TO NEAREST 100 METRES
5000	1. Read letters identifying 100,000 metre square in which point lies
0000	2. Look for 100,000 grid line to LEFT of point and read LARGE figure indicating the line in either the top or bottom margin
0000	3. Same for 100,000 grid line to RIGHT of point and read LARGE figure indicating the line in either the left or right margin
0000	4. Look for 10,000 grid line BELOW point and read LARGE figure indicating the line in either the left or right margin
0000	5. Same for 10,000 grid line to RIGHT of point
0000	6. Example: 5000 0000 0000 0000
0000	7. Example: 5000 0000 0000 0000

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
