



CHAIN ADS-203 BASS STRAIT

SLAVE II ACCESS

Follow the Princes Highway south from Sydney to the town of Sale in Victoria. Turn left onto the South Gippsland Highway for 35 miles to the village of Woodside. Turn left before the Hotel. After a few hundred yards the road swings sharp right and then a few hundred yards further it turns sharp left.

Follow the straight road for $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles until just before the sand dunes. There is a cutting which permits access to a picnic reserve. Before this cutting there is a field gate and track to the left. Follow this track for a hundred yards and then turn off to the right onto a ridge.

The station marker consists of 36 inches of Galvanized iron pipe beneath ground level, set in an 8 inch square of concrete. The above ground mark is 18 inches of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch diameter galvanized iron pipe screwed into the lower section. The station mast may be set exactly over the marker by unscrewing the top 18 inches, but a good chain wrench is required. It is not possible to set the mast alongside the marker since the pipe will extend above the mast insulation.

Note: The field in which the station is sited, belongs to Tom Foat of Woodside.
