

II. AREA OF OPERATIONS

The work area was extensive and was actually in the waters of three states in Australia. It extended from Jervis Bay in New South Wales to Eden in the same state, along the east coast. From Eden the work area extended southwest across Bass Strait to the northeast tip of Tasmania. The last phase of the program again crossed the Bass Strait from the northwest tip of Tasmania to just south of the Victorian coastline.

Because of the extent and rapid progress of the program CNI's base of operations changed several times. It was located at:

Narooma, N.S.W.	13 August to 18 August
Eden, N.S.W.	18 August to 23 August
Yarram, Victoria	23 August to 5 Sept.
Beech Forrest, Victoria	6 Sept. to 10 Sept.
Portland, Victoria	10 Sept. to 14 Sept.
Melbourne, Victoria	14 Sept. to 18 Sept.

From these locations activities of the field crew were directed and radiotelephone communications maintained.

III. FIELD OPERATIONS RECAP

The vessel utilized during the survey was the M/V TELEDEX IV. Shoran indicating equipment was already installed from a previous operation.

Initial base station installation began on August 13 and was completed on August 15, 1969.
