

STATION: THE NUT (ST 674) (continued)

It will take two or three days with 4 or 5 laborers to carry the equipment to the station site. An average round-trip from the car park to the station site, walking up with a load and returning unburdened will take from 60 to 90 minutes, depending on the load. The cement track to the summit is very difficult to negotiate with heavy objects with the center hand rail. When possible, a helicopter should be use to mobilize and demobilize this station. During the July 1984 operation, the station was mobilized manually and demobilized by helicopter. It is approximately 50 kilometers from the Wynyard Airport to The Nut. The station and operator was lifted from the station site to the Stanley Football Ground, a 5 minutes' flight. The helicopter pilot arranged with the Stanley Football Club for permission to use the football grounds.
