Report on Coastal Examination, Albina to Wanderer River

Dates of Examination: 1st January to 22nd January, 1957.

Location of Camps: Birthday Creek, Watsons Creek, Manly Beach and Wanderer River.

Means of Transport and Supply: Helicopter

General Topography of the Area: Typical rugged coastline, broken very occasionally by long sandy beaches.

Geological Investigations and Findings:

This coastal traverse has provided valuable information on the lithologies of the Pre-Cambrian, Cambrian, Ordovician, Silurian and Devonian rocks and has even provided exposures of the Permian beds. Fairly detailed information on lithological variation within these systems has been gathered and will be of great assistance to geophysical interpretation.

A fair idea of the types of structures to be found over the South-West has also been obtained from the magnificent cliff sections ~~cliff sections~~.

There is not a trace of significant mineralisation along this stretch of coastline.
