135-140	<u>Clay</u> , as 80-85 above, rare medium brown inclusions, rare dolerite fragments.
140-145	<u>Clay</u> , as 80-85 above, slight orange-brown tinges.
145-150	<u>Clay</u> , medium grey and brown, scattered very finely divided mica, finely textured, well compacted.
150-155	<u>Clay</u> , as 80-85 above.
155-160	<u>Clay</u> , as 80-85 above.
160-165	<u>Clay</u> , as 80-85 above.
165-170	<u>Clay</u> , as 140-145 above.
170-175	<u>Clay</u> , as 140-145 above.
175-180	<u>Clay</u> , as 140-145 above, rare rose coarsely grained, sub-rounded, quartz.
180-185	<u>Clay</u> , as 140-145 above.
185-190	<u>Silt</u> , mottled light orange brown and white scattered very coarse grained quartz and quartzite, coarsely textured, moderately compacted.
190-195	<u>Silt</u> , white to light brown, scattered well rounded coal and carbonaceous wood grains, scattered medium grey clay stringers, medium textured, moderately compacted.
