## STRATIGRAPHIC DESCRIPTION

- 425-430 Sandy Clay, as 385-390 above
- 430-435 Sandy Clay, as 385-390 above
- 435-440 Silty Sand, medium to light grey, clear, minor light brown and orange, very finely to medium grained, sub-angular, poorly sorted quartz, very dirty, common light brown silty interstitial, scattered carbonaceous wood fragments, friable, loosely compacted.
- 440-445 Silty Clay, light fawn, rare to scattered white and yellow clay inclusions, common (50%) carbonaceous wood fragments, coarsely textured, moderately compacted.
- 445-450 Clay, as 440-445 above, but not silty.
- 450-455 Clay, as 440-445 above, but not silty.
- 455-460 Silty Clay (30%) as 440-445 above, but scattered very light, greenish-white, finely textured silt and carbonaceous wood fragments (70%)
- 460-465 Carbonaceous Wood fragments 80%, clay as 455-460 above
- 465-470 Carbonaceous Wood fragments 80%, clay light fawn and medium brown, scattered light brown silty patches, medium to coarsely textured, loosely to moderately compacted.
- 470-475 Carbonaceous Wood fragments 90%, clay as 455-460 above.
- 475-480 Carbonaceous Wood fragments, rare clay as above
- 480-485 Clay, medium to dark brown, scattered greenish-white finely textured silt (tuff)?, scattered to common carbonaceous wood fragments, rare orange glassy mineral, coarsely textured, moderately compacted.
- 485-490 Carbonaceous Wood fragments and clay as in 465-470 above, plus scattered very light-greenish-white silt (tuff?)
- 490-495 Carbonaceous Wood fragments and clay as 485-470 above
- 495-500 Carbonaceous Wood fragments 95% clay as 485-490 above.
