

PHYSIOGRAPHY

The southern portion of the Elliott Bay area under discussion in this report is generally flat, gradually sloping seaward and is approximately 60 - 150 metres in elevation. (See Photo No. 1). The dominant features are Mt. Osmund (368 metres) and Wart Hill (238 metres). The Lewis, Hudson and Little Rocky Rivers and their tributaries are deeply incised and thickly vegetated.

North of Mt. Osmund and including the Wanderer and the Mainwaring rivers region the topography varies from gently undulating to steeply dissected exposed slopes.
