An estimated reserve for Queen Dyke is as follows:

Length	:	300 metres
Width	:	8 metres
Depth	:	RL 575 to RL635 i.e. 60 metres
S.G.	:	3.0
Tonnes	:	400,000
Grade	:	Unknown - say 0.5% Sn

A limited tonnage may be available as extensions to White Face/Stanhope Dykes at depth and to the east.

No figures have been estimated for vein-type deposits.

10. MINING

The following mining practice is envisaged for Mt. Bischoff:

Mining of the dolomite sulphide lode would be by open pitting, stockpiling the lower grade porphyry, which occurs within the pit, for treatment after the dolomite. An overburden ratio of about 4 or 5:1 is estimated for the pit, and about 250,000 tonnes of porphyry would lie within the pit boundary. The majority of the porphyry is not amenable to open pit mining and would be mined, using diesel trackless underground mining methods, from a decline from the pit bottom. An annual mining rate of 300,000 tonnes could be expected.
