

We hereby apply for renewal of Exploration Licence No 1/68 over the existing area of 175 square kilometres for the period 1st January to 31st December 1982. Attached hereto is the original licence document and our cheque for the sum of \$3,326.50 in payment of the fee and rental calculated as follows:

In support of our application we set out below a summary of the work undertaken and currently in progress in the six months ending 31 December 1981. Full details will be supplied in our Six-Monthly Report due on 31 December 1981.

A summary of proposed future exploration for 1982 along with the estimated expenditure is included.

1. Work Completed or in Progress

Road access is currently being established into Dighem anomalies 19C, 54B, 59B and 63A. These tracks are being surveyed and geologically mapped as they progress. Anomaly 19C is scheduled to be investigated by the establishment of a grid which will be geologically mapped, auger sampled and surveyed. The ground locations of anomalies 54A, 59B and 63A will also be determined.

A set of 1:10 000 base plans have been compiled utilising Lands Department machine plots of the area.

2. Proposed Exploration Programme 1982

Target Sn, Cu, Cr, Au, Pt, Pd and Os

- 2.1. Grid lines will be established over Dighem anomalies 54A, 59B and 63A. These will be geologically mapped, auger sampled and surveyed.
- 2.2. Ground magnetic surveys will be carried out on the newly established tracks and grid lines.
- 2.3. Track access into the group of Dighem anomalies 25A, 29A and 37B will be established, and these anomalies will be located on the ground.
- 2.4. Access into Dighem anomaly 5A will be established, and the location of the anomaly determined.
- 2.5. During the winter the ground location of anomaly 45 fid 1043 will be determined and a grid established. The grid lines will be geologically mapped and surveyed, auger sampled and surveyed by magnetometer.
- 2.6. Ground electromagnetic surveys will be carried out over the established grid lines at 19C, 54A, 59B, 63A and 45 fid 1043 and over lines at 44A and 21G.
- 2.7. Drainage systems in the north western sector of the tenement will be sediment and heavy concentrate sampled.
- 2.8. A photogeological study with field checks will be carried out as an aid to the geological assessment of the region.
