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The source of the -80 mesh gold in stream sediments further upstream is not known. The magnitude of the anomalies is down to about an order of magnitude lower than -80 mesh values from the Voyager 24 area.

Some initial follow-up mapping and panned-concentrate stream sediment sampling is probably warranted but should be tempered by the outcome of Voyager 24 investigations.

Several geochemical 'peaks' have been defined over the area of acid volcanics extending from about 925W (Mainwaring River) to about 3000W. Some of these soil geochemical anomalies appear to be associated with (pyritic) black siltstones and possibly magnetic anomalies.

More detailed geological mapping should be carried out over the zone of acid volcanics with the object of defining the relationships between geochem/magnetic anomalies and the underlying rock types.

In the light of Voyager 19 geochemical results it would probably be instructive to resample the whole zone (Mainwaring River to 3000W) with a Jacro auger at 12.5m intervals or even closer.
