COMSTAFF PROPRIETARY LIMITEDQUARTERLY REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF MINES, TASMANIAFOR THE PERIOD 1ST OCTOBER TO 31ST DECEMBER 1982EXPLORATION LICENCE 1/681. WORK COMPLETED OR IN PROGRESS

Road access to the three northern Dighem anomalies 54A, 63A and 59B was achieved and work is now underway to determine the source. This comprises drainage sampling at 200m intervals of the water courses around the anomalies, geological mapping, surveying and grid cutting. Road access has been established to Dighem anomaly 19A via an old track from the Savage River Pipe Line Road. Track access to the north western group of Dighem anomalies 25A, 29A and 37B is currently being established.

Heavy concentrate samples are being collected from creeks in the vicinity of the Dighem and aeromagnetic anomalies.

2. RESULTS ACHIEVED

No results have been received for the sediment and heavy concentrate samples so far collected. Geological mapping of tracks and creeks in the vicinity of the northern group of Dighem anomalies has shown that the rock sequence consists of thinly bedded sediments and more massive quartzites. Lithologies include siliceous siltstone, quartz sandstone, quartzite, phyllite, graphitic shale and siltstone. The rock units are tightly folded and contorted, with a general strike direction of NE-SW.

3. WORK PROPOSED FOR THE NEXT QUARTER

1. Grid lines will be established over the northern Dighem anomalies 54A, 59B and 63A now accessible from Fourex Road. The source of the airborne EM responses should be determined by an integrated programme of soil sampling, stream sediment and heavy concentrate sampling, geological mapping, ground magnetics and Pulse EM.

2. Locate and assess prospectivity of the western Dighem anomalies 19A, 25A, 29A and 37B. It is proposed to carry out drainage sampling and mapping in the region of the anomalies. Grid lines would be established across the locality of the airborne responses. These lines would be surveyed, soil sampled and geologically mapped. Ground geophysical surveys in the form of magnetics and Pulse EM would be carried out in order to locate and define the anomalies.
3. Drainage systems in the western and north western sectors of the tenement will be sediment and heavy concentrate sampled along with geological mapping and prospecting. Helicopter based camps may be used at this stage. The concentration of effort would be on the more possible prospective areas as determined from studies of the aeromagnetics, Dighem data, aerial photographic and landsat data.
4. Access to Dighem anomaly 5A will be established via Bald Hill and the location of the anomaly determined. Geological mapping and sampling would be required to establish the potential prospectivity and to see if grid line cutting is warranted.


