

is likely to be quite inaccurate: "it may well be due to aerodynamic noise" (Peters and Dvorak, 1982). Two separate and isolated possible anomalies (amplitudes less than 3ppm) were also defined. Resistivities were mostly high and several magnetic anomalies were outlined.

2.9.5 Planned Work

A major programme of exploration is planned for the Huxley prospect in the 1982-83 year. This is to follow up the anomalous geochemical results and the Dighem anomaly, which occur within altered acid volcanics.

The work will comprise gridding, mapping, geochemical and geophysical surveys, and drilling if warranted.
