Group Symbol (unified soil classification system): SP-SM

Geological Description: [water worn gravel + clayey sands]

Rough layers of sand, pebbles. Tert. river gravels and sands, predominantly sand sized particles, much material > .5cm, coarse current bedding shown.

History: Clarke himself started this pit about 13 yrs ago + has worked it since.

Remarks: Material = sand, pebbles + concrete gravel. Sand + gravel used locally. Pebbles sold mainly to Hobart market. S.J. Clarke also owns orchard, sheep etc. Pit only part of his income. Humes Pipes have worked here, but didn't last as Clarke said they were too wasteful. Selectively worked depending on material required.
